#### Safer Schools

An enthusiastic start to 2019 for the Haughmond Federation with a 'Safer School Group' meeting. Last week, Mrs Peters and the heads of the two schools Mrs Maddox and Ms Twidale, held a regular 'Safer School Group' meeting at the Harlescott Junior site. This was a large gathering of pupils, staff, a governor/ Councillor, the Police, Shrewsbury Academy, Explorers and myself representing Shropshire Council. During the meeting, we reviewed the incident recording sheets and both Sundorne Infants and Harlescott Junior presented their completed security/safety checklists. The main discussion point of the meeting was the highway surrounding the Harlescott Junior school. With such good support to the meeting, we were able to discuss and consider many options for improving the highway at the start and end of the school day and two pupils provided a personal overview of their highway concerns. The meeting concluded with forming an action plan for Safer Schools including road safety. Overall, a thorough and positive meeting and a future Safer School Group meeting is planned for the Summer term at Sundorne Infants. Excellent work by Mrs Peters, staff, pupils and governors.

#### Headlice-Information & Guidance

#### Prevention - can you stop them?

Combing is an important part of good personal care, but head lice are not easily damaged by it. Good hair care may help to spot lice early and so help to control them.

The best way to stop infection is for families to learn how to check their own heads. This way they can find any lice before they have a chance to breed. They can then treat them and stop them going round the family.

The way to check heads is called 'detection combing'. It can be done as often as families want to, but should be done weekly.

If a living, moving louse is found on one of the family's heads, the others should be checked carefully. Any family members who have living lice on their heads should be treated at the same time

#### **Detection combing**

You need: fine toothed detection comb (from the chemist), good lighting, and an ordinary comb.

- Wash the hair well, then dry it with a towel.
- The hair should be damp, not dripping
- Comb the hair with an ordinary comb.
- You can buy a detection comb from the chemist.
- Start with the teeth of the detection comb touching the skin of the scalp at the top of the head. Draw the comb carefully towards the end of the hair shafts.
- Do this over and over again from the top of the head to the edge of the hair in all directions, working round the head.
- Do this for several minutes. It takes 10 to 15 minutes to do it properly for each head.
- If there are head lice, you will find one or more lice on the teeth of the comb.
- Head lice are little insects with moving legs.
- Clean the comb under the tap. A nail brush helps to do this.

#### How to treat head lice

You should only ever treat someone for head lice if you have found a living, moving louse.

The best treatment is to use lotion (not shampoo and mousses) from the chemist. Your doctor may issue you with a prescription.

Always follow manufacturers' instructions on how to use the lotion. How long you leave the lotion on the head may vary depending on the product.



#### **GDPR Privacy Notices**

We would like to say a big thank you to all of the parents that have returned a signed copy of our privacy notice. It is essential that we hold a signed notice for your child and we therefore will be asking parents to sign a copy before half term should we not already have received one.

Thank you in advance for your co-operation.

#### **Sickness**

We would like to make all parents aware that if your child becomes ill with sickness and/or diarrhoea, your child will need to be kept off from school until at least 48 hours after their last symptom. This is to try and prevent the spread of any illnesses across the schools.

#### **Administering Medicines**

We have had several occasions recently when children have brought medicine into school without a parent completing the appropriate forms beforehand. If your



child requires any
prescribed medication
whilst in school, a 'Parental
Agreement to Administer
Medicine Form' must be
completed outlining the
dosage, timings, etc and the
medicine must be brought

in in the original packaging with the prescription label. This includes inhalers. This is to ensure we fully understand your child's needs and support their wellbeing. Non prescribed medicine such as Calpol will only be given in exceptional circumstances with the approval of the Head of School. Please bring the medicine that your child requires to the Main Office where you will be able to complete the form needed.
