### E-Safety—MOMO

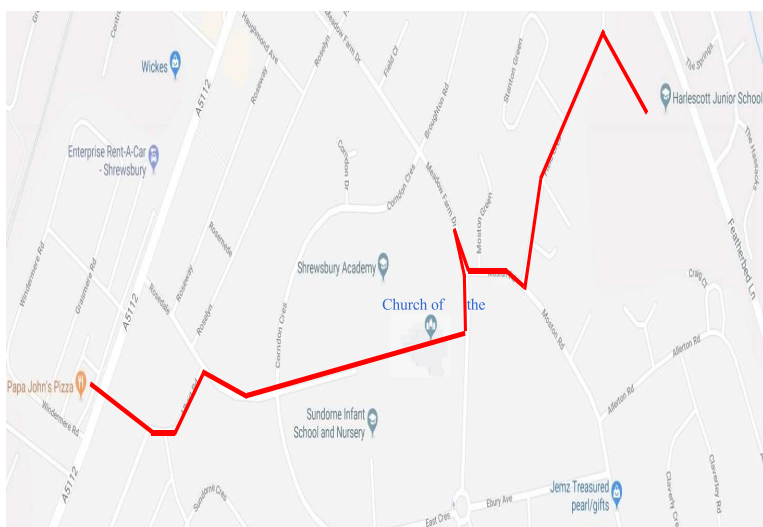
We have uploaded a MOMO Online Safety Guide for Parents onto our website. We would recommend that you read this over the weekend in order to be aware of the dangers of MOMO.
