#### **Attendance Notice**

By law, schools must take a morning and afternoon register and record the attendance or absence of every pupil. The Attendance Registers are marked twice each day; at the start of the morning session and again in the afternoon. All absences and cases of persistent lateness are investigated. If your child will not be in school, you must report your child's absence. If your child is absent and we have not been given a reason, you will receive a text message asking you to contact school. If we still have no response we will then make a phone call to try to make contact. If this also fails then details will be passed on to our family support worker who may do a home visit if he is unable to make contact.

#### Late arrivals

It is important that classes make a prompt and effective start at the beginning of the school day. The Head of School monitors lateness of pupils as punctuality to school is crucial. Lateness into school causes disruption to that individual's learning and to that of the other pupils in the class. It is of extreme importance therefore that all pupils arrive at school on time.

The school gates are locked at 9:00am and parents are unable to use the gates after this time. You will need to make your way to the school office to sign your child in. After 9:00am, parents are unable to take their child into school so a member of staff will help them put their things away and make sure they get to their class. If your child is late after 9:15am this will be put as an unauthorised absence unless we have had prior notice that it is due to a medical appointment.

When a pupil has been late on four occasions a school late letter will be sent home to inform parents of the numbers of times their child has been late. If there is no improvement, the EWO will become involved.

#### Children's belongings

Please ensure that your child has everything they need when they come into school such as PE kits, Forest School kits, book bags, named water bottles etc. as it causes disruption to classes when these items are brought in late.

#### The Big School Swim

Year 6 children took part in the Big School Swim on Thursday 14th November. The children enjoyed their swimming lesson and have received certificates for taking part! There are some other exciting activities for the children to do later on the year too!
